

Hubbard Sanctuary

Chaplin, CT

The Hubbard Sanctuary is a 30 acre parcel that was donated to the Trust in 1985 by Miss Molly Hubbard. Adjacent is Agnes' Pasture, a 16 acre addition to the preserve acquired from Agnes Fuller in 2009. Together these two parcels provide diverse habitats for wildlife as well as a scenic walk. A 17 acre alfalfa field lies at the center of the property. A glacial outwash plain, it is stone-free, level land that will stay in agricultural use. A 3 acre pond south of the field provides an excellent birding site. Because the neighboring state land is actively hunted, visitors to the Hubbard Sanctuary are advised to wear blaze orange in hunting season.

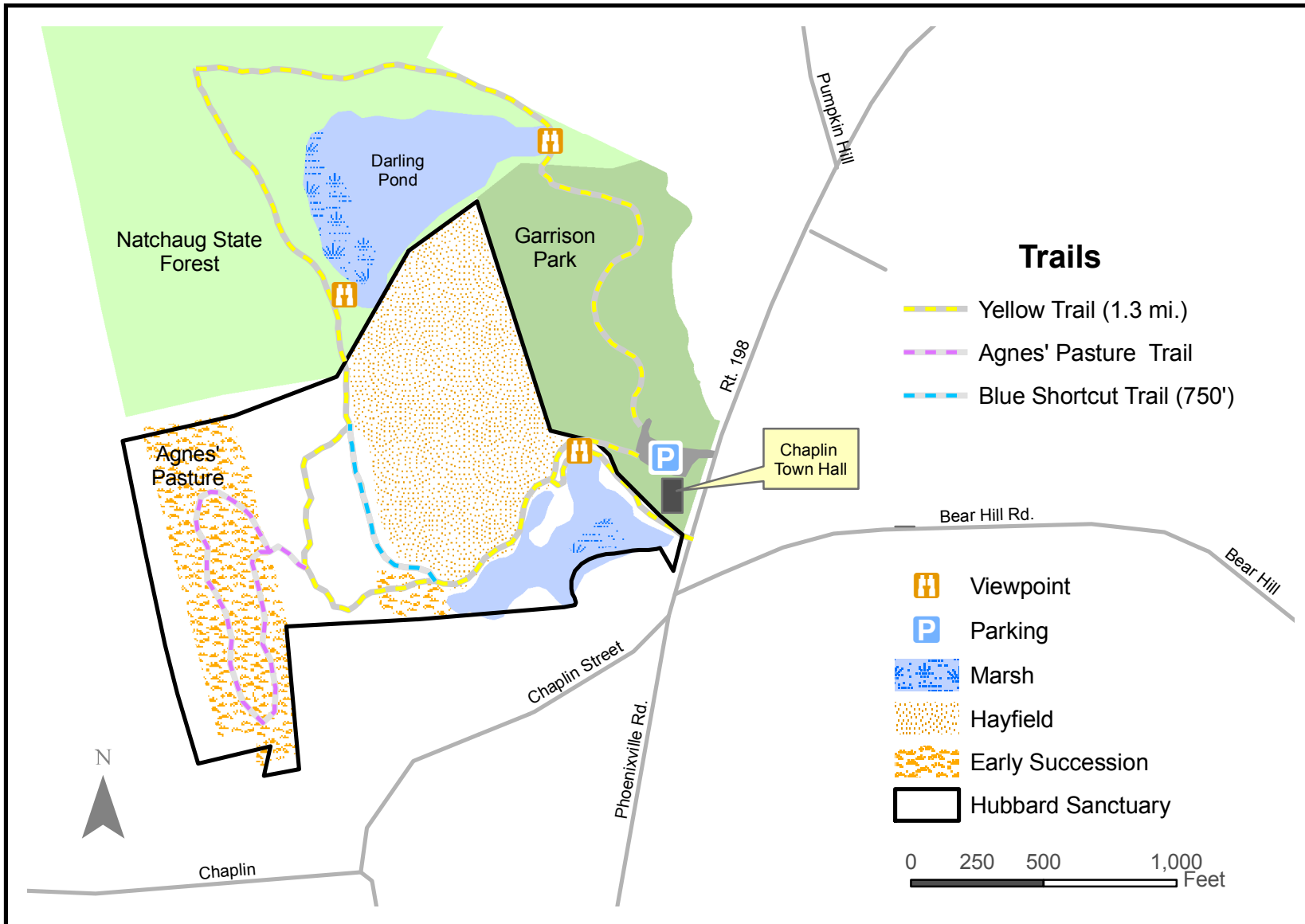

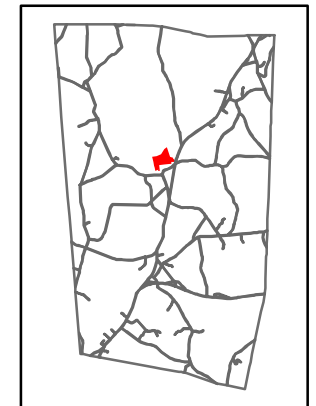
