

# Löf Woodlands

Mansfield, CT

Löf Woodlands is an 18-acre preserve that was donated to the Trust in 2009 by John Löf. For 30 years, he tapped maple trees on the property to produce maple syrup, while his wife Ruth operated a bird-banding station where she banded over 10,000 birds.

Today the property features a mature mixed hardwood forest with some majestic oaks measuring over 20" in diameter. The half mile trail is level and mostly dry, and is appropriate for cross-country skiing as well as a pleasant woodland walk.



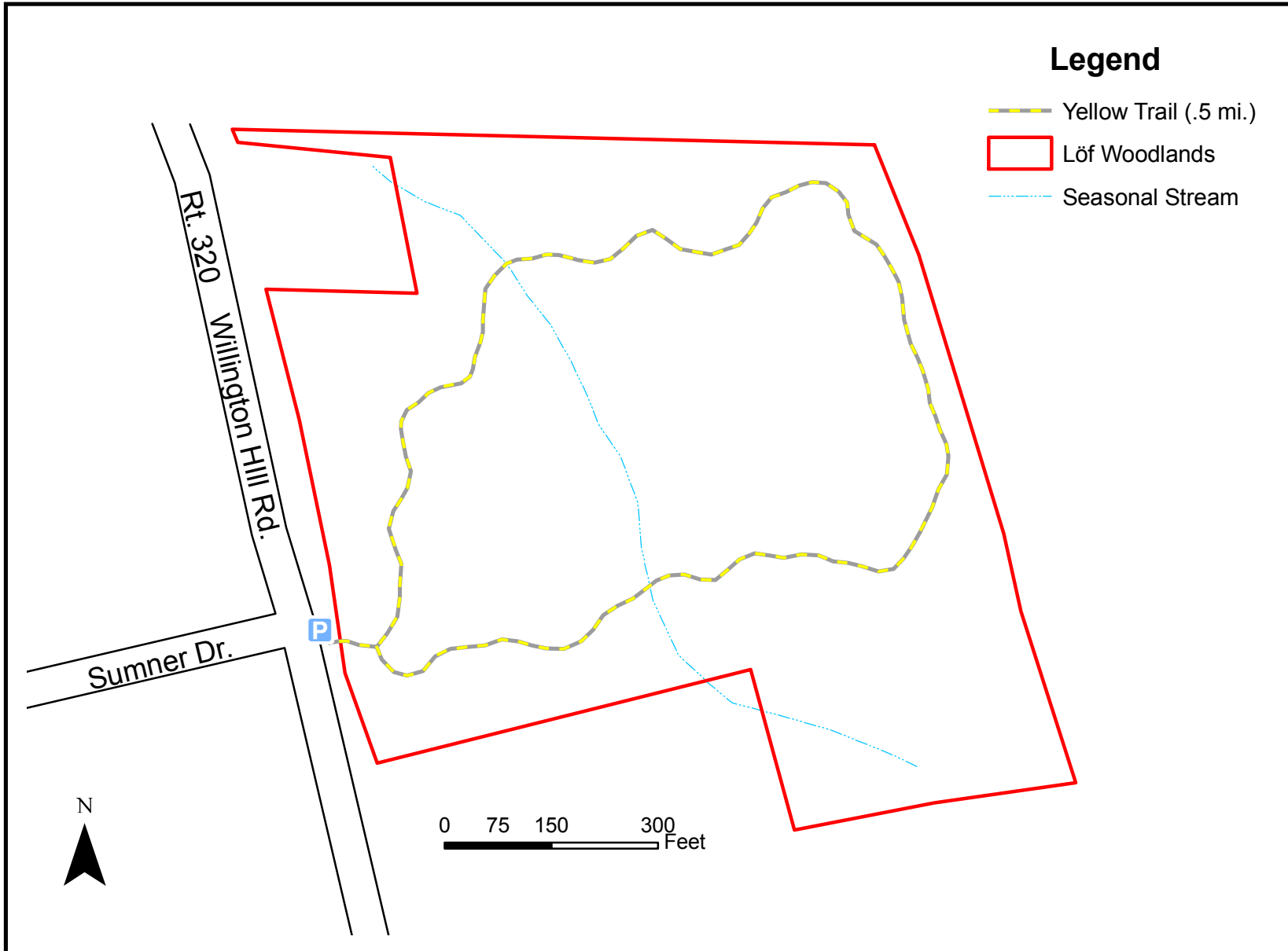

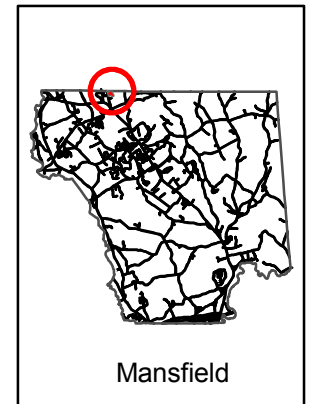
